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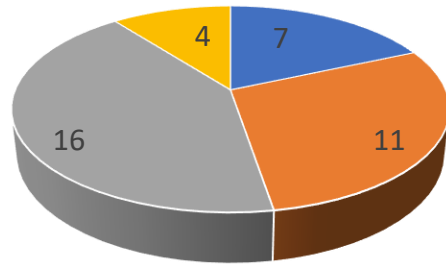

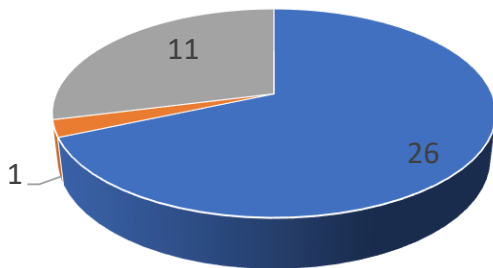

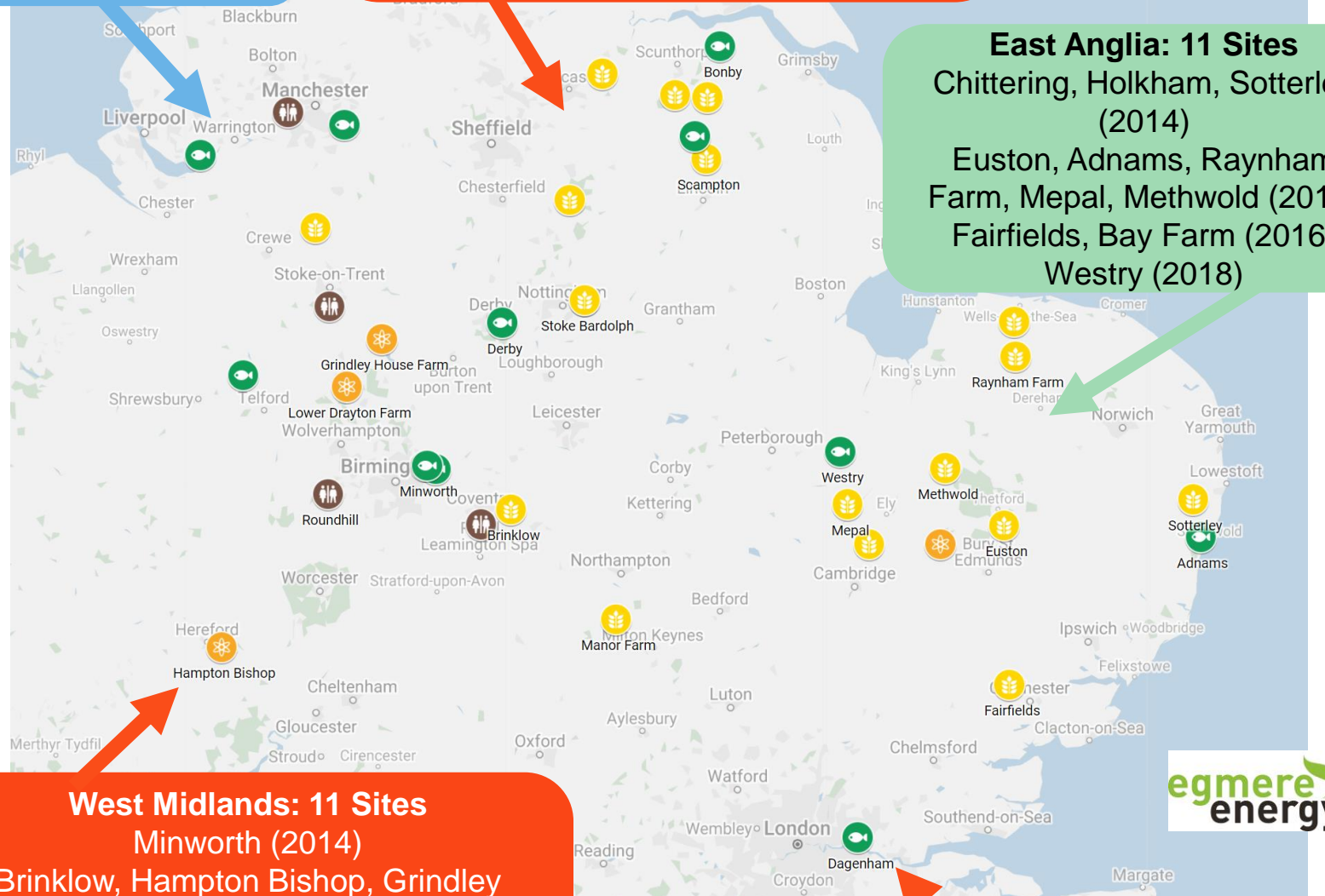

The Government has now launched the Green Gas Support Scheme (GGSS), alongside information about the Green Gas Levy (GGL). The GGL will place obligations on licensed gas suppliers, including a requirement to make quarterly levy payments, in order to fund the GGSS. The GGSS is now open for applications until autumn 2025. The key aims of the GGSS are to encourage deployment of new AD biomethane plants in order to increase the proportion of green gas in the gas grid, create jobs and attract investment and minimise a market hiatus for the biomethane industry moving from quarterly to annual spending review.

With a total of 38 sites now connected and 6 planned for the remainder of 2021 and into 2022, our focus is on engaging with our customers and ensuring milestones are met and our data is complete and accurate.

The GDNs have been working together over the past few years to bring consistency to the delivery of biomethane connections across our networks. This has been driven by the need to remove barriers to connect, reduce costs for all and to make it easier for customers and their supply chains to work across our areas. This work has latterly been supported with the introduction of the Customer Entry Forum, a group comprising of GDNs, biomethane operators, industry bodies such as ADBA and REA and the biomethane design and build supply chain.
