Infills Specifications and guidance

'Infills' is a term applied to communities where there are a number of existing properties that do not have a connection to a gas supply. These are often remote communities situated some distance from a relevant gas main. Where a number of potential customers request that an infill project is undertaken, the gas transporter will determine the connection charge at the beginning of the scheme.

If you are interested in bringing gas mains to your area, you will need to make an infill request. You can do this by filling in our <u>enquiry form</u> and returning this to us using the details included in the form. The initial enquiry would need to be made by one representative, who would act as the sole point of contact for the village or town who are interested in having gas mains brought into the requested area.

Upon receipt of this form, our Non-Standard Connections team will design and produce an Infill response which will provide you with a budget indication to bring gas to your location. To then make the scheme viable you will need to canvass the premise owners with the budget costs to establish if at least 40% of the premises would be interested.

For an infill to become viable and proceed, at least 40% of the village or town would need to be interested and accept and pay for any firm quotations produced before any works are undertaken. Part of the cost for the gas main will be covered by Cadent Gas Ltd and the rest of the cost will then be divided by the number of parties interested in going forward with this proposed gas main. Should any parties wish to connect to the mains laid as part of the infill scheme, who were not originally a part of the initial works, they will not be eligible for a standard connections charge and will be charged a portion of the mains element accordingly.
